INSTANT ADMISSIONS

*** Don't miss this incredible opportunity ***

Wallkill Senior High School will host its annual Instant Admission event this November! Instant Admissions is an event where students have the opportunity to meet with different college admissions representatives and receive an immediate admission decision. There will be a mix of in person and virtual opportunities at this event.

Looking to participate? Here's what you should do:

- Sign up for the event in the School Counseling Office or check Schoology for the registration link
 - Sign up for the schools you are interested in
- Make sure you complete and submit applications for all colleges you are interested in <u>at least</u> one week in advance of the event
 - Some colleges use Common App, some use individual platforms, some use paper applications. If you are unsure which type of application your college prefers, see your school counselor for assistance
- Once all documents have been submitted, begin preparing for the event by going on the college websites to learn more about the school
- The morning of your assigned day, come to the school counseling office and get the supporting documents you will need
- Meet with your admissions representative during the timeslot you've been assigned to

Other important notes:

- Dress for success!
- Be prompt
- Most colleges will waive the application fee for students participating in this event (with the exception of 4-year SUNY schools)

SEPTEMBER HIGHLIGHTS

We had a very exciting and busy start to this new school year! Here's a quick recap of some of what we have accomplished with students so far:

- All 284 senior students have met with their school counselor for their senior meeting to discuss post-secondary plans.
- We have had 45 College Representative Visits with about 15 more to go. Students have had the chance to ask questions and learn more about a specific school. Many juniors and seniors have taken advantage of this opportunity.
- We held 2 in-person PSAT Readiness Check Sessions with Juniors for the new Digital PSAT format. Between the 2 days and a few students stopping by guidance, 58 Juniors have received help in making sure they are ready for the test.

ESTIMATED FAMILY CONTRIBUTION CALCULATOR

Did you hear that the Federal Government mandated all colleges and university to post Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) calculator on all their websites?

This calculator helps estimate how much a student's family will be expected to contribute towards the cost of attendance for the year, and what their financial aid eligibility looks like.

If you're unable to contribute the entire cost of college, financial aid is available to bridge the gap. That's how the financial aid system works. The difference between the total cost and the student's EFC is considered the student's financial need and the amount of aid you may be eligible to receive.

Directions to Participate:

- 1. Log into your Chromebook and 365
- 2. On the top left had corner, click the little square and drop down to NAVIANCE
- 3. Use CLEVER as single sign on and no password is needed
- 4. Naviance Homepage
- 5. See "What's New"
- 6. Register to meet with college
- 7. Save the date on your calendar phone
- 8. If you have a class during the same time as your visit with the college, let your teacher know.

Transcripts and GPA

It is <u>NEVER</u> too early to start looking at your transcripts and working on your GPA. Your transcript and GPA are important for:

- Improving your chances of getting into a college of your choice.
- Getting into AP (Advance Placement classes), ADV, and college level classes that will further boost your GPA.
- Getting a job after high school.
- Receiving scholarships.





Students participating in AP courses will be required to make a non-refundable payment for scheduled AP exams by Tuesday,

November 14th.

Freshman Meetings

The Counseling Dept. is using the month of October to meet with the Freshman class. These meetings consist of counselor introductions, graduation requirements, and club/extracurricular information. They are a great opportunity for students to ask questions and gather information as they settle into the school year!

Tips for Success in High School

- Never be afraid to reach out for help from your teachers or us.
- Engage in your class discussions; this helps the teachers to get to know you.
- · Keep an eye out for any extracurricular activities
- Use a calendar or planner to keep track of your classes and all due dates.
- Keep vour workspace clean
- Show up for ALL of your classes
- Each exam costs \$98
- Students who qualify for free reduced lunch (must be approved and on file in District Office), pay \$53
- Checks are made payable to Wallkill Senior High School (please include student name and name of exam on check)
- Checks should be given directly to Mrs. Marvulli in the School Counseling Office



Tips for Mastering Time Management



- 1. Plan ahead by creating a to-do list
 - Identify what you need to do, prioritize based on due dates and how much time you need to complete it
- 2. Identify time wasters and set goals
 - It's easy to get distracted. Do you find yourself:
 - i. Spending too much time checking social media?
 - ii. Texting or answering phone calls while studying?
 - No matter what is wasting your time, set a goal not to engage in that behavior during dedicated study time. Instead, use those activities as a reward for staying focused and accomplishing the tasks you set out to complete
- 3. Tackle small tasks to start
 - When large projects and big exams make you feel overwhelmed, the anxiety can make you want to procrastinate. Starting with simpler, shorter or smaller tasks can help ease into the work and build your confidence to move onto larger tasks.
- 4. Establish routines
 - Setting a routine can help you accomplish the things you need to do. Is your house quietest early in the morning? You may want to get in the habit of regularly using that time to read or study.
- 5. Take time off
 - It's important to take time to give your mind a rest. Long study sessions or large chunks of time working on assignments should be broken up with small breaks.
 Don't let yourself burn out.
